 - **Paediatric, adolescent, family, public health** on international basis at senior consultant level. Working with deprived groups across varied cultures including refugee youth. My work has been acknowledged in a chapter of the book ‘Teens and Their Doctors - The Story of the Development of Adolescent Medicine’¹ (extract appended below)

 - **Refugees and Asylum Seekers** – have conducted studies of children and youth in war zones including Afghanistan and regularly perform medical assessments for young refugees including torture and risk assessments. Lectured re Age Assessment to the IGC (Intergovernmental Consultations on Migration, Asylum and Refugees) in Geneva 2011 and provided teaching materials to the Age Determination Team, NATO - Department of Immigration and Citizenship Australia 2013.

 - **Psychological, psychotherapeutic, mental health work** with individuals and families - have worked with addicted and psychopathic personalities and a variety of disorders such as borderline personalities, learning disabilities and with children in situations of physical, emotional and sexual abuse. Dual qualifications in paediatrics and mental health give me a unique perspective of the dynamics of disordered families and this has been invaluable in the assessment of families where fabricated or induced illness has been suspected. My involvement with cases of FII (Previously known as Munchausen syndrome) has included several families and young parents who were admitted for observation to our residential unit

in South London (1990 – 2002) where we cared for ‘high risk’ cases sent from all over the UK and many families assessed in the community. Our methods in the residential unit included video surveillance in some cases.

Psychotherapy on group, individual, family and couples basis.

- **Research** - am a leading authority on adolescent health and early pregnancy and parenting and have conducted Longitudinal studies of our patient groups over a twenty year time span and have worked on the British Cohort studies (London University) and Millennium Cohort (Institute of Child Health). We have also conducted studies on traumatic stress in Italy and field studies with children and young people in Afghanistan.
- **Assessment & Medico-legal work** As a leading authority on Child Protection, Adolescence, teenage pregnancy and early parenting am often called upon to prepare legal reports for the courts on young people and families particularly in child protection, family disturbance, substance abuse and domestic violence as well as Factitious Illness syndromes and family conflicts, custody and contact issues and child alienation.
- **Child Protection** - I am frequently asked to assess and report on cases involving child protection both physical and sexual abuse and cases of FII. I have extensive experience of identifying child abuse, physical and sexual and in identifying the types of physical abuses, whether it be slaps, blows or marks caused by human hand or foot or indeed teeth; and marks caused by implements; scalds and burns and injuries caused by strangulation or other means. They all need to be distinguished from lesions which can result from accidents or from other mechanisms such as organic causes and physical illness – for example bleeding disorders or illnesses such as meningitis that can cause petechiae which may also be seen in abusive pressure or strangulation. I have also been involved in teaching others how to make these diagnoses and how they should look out for various suspicious signs. I have taught doctors and medical students, teachers, social workers and the police.
- **Assessment and medico legal work** has been formally evaluated in published work. emotional difficulties; education, care, therapy and general support with day nursery, baby unit and assessment services on site.

- Family assessment and risk assessment is an important part of the work. Frequent consultations as an **expert witness** for court cases regarding child protection and family problems. Member of the Academy of Experts.
- As **Director of Youth Support** also **chair** Youth Support's multidisciplinary Forum on Adolescent Health and Welfare.
- Served as a member of the **House of Commons Committee** on the abortion act in respect of issues affecting the young and member of Medical Board of the Brook Advisory centres.
- Provide **medical and psychotherapeutic** input to **Youth Support**. Plan and supervise a therapeutic programme for patients including provision of individual therapy, group and family work, group work with staff and trainees including supervision. Therapy may also include art, dance and psychodrama sessions. - The residential unit at Youth Support House in London operated from 1989 to 2002 when services were reorganised on an 'outpatient' and 'outreach' basis.
- Residential services are being set up internationally
- Family work is based on outreach services and encompasses assessment, rehabilitation and therapeutic work often from a medico-legal perspective .
- Teen pregnancy research is continuing beyond its 25th year
- Vocation services and training for young people are organised both in UK and abroad and extend to media and IT. Videos of research and young parenthood have been produced.
- Documentary production regarding issues affecting youth and teaching materials. This includes 'Not an Easy Road' on teenage pregnancy; 'Generations' on Professor Neville Butler and the cohort studies; 'Asylum' on young refugees and asylum seeking children.

Diana Birch pioneered adolescent health in the UK.

Birch: “I have always had an interest in young people; I began with looking after pregnant schoolgirls, who did not have a structure of support and, as ‘children having children,’ doubly needed such support. This work, which became a research project and MD thesis in the early-to-mid eighties, led to the founding of the charity Youth Support in 1986. [See sidebar]

At that time I established links with my colleagues in Jamaica and also in the USA and joined SAM and the incipient IAAH at the Congress in Australia in 1987. This was also when I met **Richard MacKenzie** and **Edie Moore** who remained good friends thereafter.

“In the UK we did not have a career structure for Adolescent Medicine and hence I have always regarded my American colleagues as my peer group and arranged my own training by doing courses in sexual medicine and an MSc in psychotherapy and training in drug and substance abuse. We eventually managed to open our own residential unit in south London which took cases from all over the country and some from abroad. Most had been abused.

In establishing Youth Support, Birch needed to overcome the same obstacles as her colleagues in other countries in providing care for those who were neither children nor adults.

From *The History of Youth Support*, 1996.

“Youth Support was born out of a need to provide a service for teenagers and support to schoolgirl mothers. . . the first Youth Support publication on schoolgirl pregnancy, ‘Are you my sister, Mummy’ came out in time for our first meeting. The statutory services—health, education, and social services were not catering to this age group and there was a danger that the medical services particularly were dividing care into paediatrics—i.e. children’s services--and adult services, with adolescents and young adults falling in the wasteland between.”

MacKenzie has a particular interest in Adolescent Medicine outside of the United States. His comments about **Birch**: “Diana Birch's interests were/are in teen pregnancy, disadvantaged youth and abused youth. She was always into integrating novel experiences for the girls - she had a pet shop down the road where the young woman worked when they were able and trusted.

“She also spent a large part of her energies and expertise assessing 'damaged' young people and testifying in court. She has written several books based on her experience, has a black belt in martial arts, and has actually done pubertal assessment work in Afghanistan and Eastern European countries to develop methods of determining chronological age to ascertain status as refugees.

Diana also focused much energy on building up the International Chapter of SAM

leading to an increase in interest from the growing number of international members.”

Birch: “I was part of the International chapter of SAM for many years and co-chaired for several years after Roger Tonkin left. (I was incidentally the president elect of IAAH and would have been the third president after David Bennett but I resigned before taking office.) I have always worked on an International basis – in Russia during the mid eighties, Jamaica from 1986, Cuba, lectured and held workshops in very many countries including China, South America, Japan. I also ran workshops in the USA--California and Kentucky. For the last ten years approximately I have had links with Afghanistan and the Middle East due to the refugee crisis and have worked with trafficked youth – girls from Africa for the sex trade or slave labour from Vietnam and the Far East.

“I base my work with youth on creative therapy drama music which allows young people from different backgrounds to work together without a language barrier. We set up world conferences and World Youth Forum which was very popular and a great experience for young people. I have produced documentaries about the work, including a short film, *Asylum*, which had a BAFTA [The British Academy of Film and Television Arts] premier and some awards.”

Sheila Campbell Forrester, a past Chief Medical Officer of Health for Jamaica, said the following: “Mrs. Pamela McNeil started the ‘Women's Centre’ for pregnant girls in Jamaica and which has been replicated in other countries. She authored the book *As My Mother Taught Me* for which Diana Birch was editor. Diana Birch is an icon of Youth Support who has dared to write on the subject of adolescents and youth, pioneered Youth Support in the UK, and has been a member of IAAH and SAHM.”

Richard MacKenzie had the last word: “Truly an unsung hero.”
